Dear Friends,

It is bittersweet for me to be writing to you for this last time. As I approach retirement at the end of this year, I am keenly aware of the moment in time in which we find ourselves. A time that is truly unprecedented in my life for the threats that we face as well as for the opportunities: a continuing pandemic that too many of us are not taking seriously, a society that demonstrably advantages white people over people of color, an economy that continues to create significant disparity in wealth, threats to our democracy that are real and truly frightening, and climate disruption that is no longer imaginary but happening before our very eyes.

And yet, it is impossible not to see hope - especially in much of what is happening right here on the South



Coast. Many people have stepped up, with earnest persistence, to undo the racial inequity that has long left our neighbors of color out of the running to meet their full potential. Many people have begun to realize that the food insecurity that became apparent in 2020 is a systemic failure that needs rethinking. Many people have started to challenge the status quo of our educational institutions in naming the need to improve early education, engage more equitably, and reimagine what success can look like for our young people. We have artistic expression that is significantly more varied and more community-based than ever before. And we have initiatives such as wind farms that are coming to fruition – that will move us toward a healthier and more sustainable economy.

We are very proud of the role that the Community Foundation plays in each of these areas, but we are also aware that we could not do it without our community. Community is in our name, it is our essence, and it is our power.

# A Legacy of Generosity - Henry H. Crapo Fund Awards \$160,000




