




Impact Update: May 2022

Educational and Employment Aspirations Get a Boost in New Bedford

6,000 students (pre-K through college-age) are receiving customized backpacks and grade-level school supplies during the 2021-2022 school year through the Schools on Wheels program, Pathways to Success. And thanks to Discovery Language Academy, adult non-native English speakers are improving their English language fluency, so they can self-advocate in the workplace and engage in civic events. These two programs are made possible, in part, by a Polaroid Fund grant from the SouthCoast Community Foundation. Twelve New Bedford nonprofits are receiving a total of \$97,000 from the Fund dedicated to enhancing the skills and education of New Bedford youth and its workforce. A colorful *Viva Fall River* mural on the side of Rt 195 is one of many recent public art installations across the city. What's helping to drive this new creative energy? In part,— the Fall River Arts and Culture Coalition (FRACC), which boasts over 100 members from all corners of Fall River who are committed to improving the lives of the people that live and work in the region. In late 2021, FRACC launched the City's first Arts & Culture Plan, which was sponsored, in part, by your Community Foundation. This multi-year plan fosters a vibrant, inclusive, and sustainable creative economy in the city.
